Older Adult Population is Growing

National

By 2030, 1 in every 5 Americans is projected to be 65+ years (AARP)

Arizona

- Arizona has nearly 1.5 million Arizonans age 60+ (DES)
- AI/AN population =385,772 (US Census 2010)
- 5.4% of Arizonans 65+ years are American Indian (DES)
- Over 800,000 Arizonans are family caregivers (DES)

Tribal

- 2 Tribal Assisted Living Facilities =
 28 Total beds (ITCA)
- 4 Skilled Living facilities = 239
 Total beds (ITCA)
- In 1 year, over 134,000 Title III
 Meals were served to Tribal
 Elders in Arizona (ITCA)
- Statewide, over 29,000 one-way trips were provided through the Title III Transportation grant funding (ITCA)
