Children's Justice Act

- Administered by DOJ, OVC
- Focuses on
 - Investigation, prosecution judicial handling of child abuse and neglect
 - Limiting add'l trauma to child

Legislative Intent

- Reduce trauma to the child victim
- Increase the chances of successful prosecution of the abuser
- Improve the procedures for protecting all children from maltreatment

Arizona Funded Programs

- Training for Child Abuse Investigators
 - Law Enforcement
 - DCS Investigators
 - Forensic Interviewers
 - Prosecutors

Arizona Funded Programs

- Children's Justice Coordinators
 - Housed at Child/Family Advocacy Centers
 - Staff Multi-Disciplinary Teams (MDTs)
 - Provide Mandatory Reporting Training to Community
 - Coconino, Gila, Maricopa, Pima (Southern Arizona), Yavapai, and Yuma County

CJTF

- Serves as Arizona's Multidisciplinary Task Force on Children's Justice
- Comprised of representatives from selected disciplines involved in handling child abuse and neglect cases.
- Conducts the Three-Year Statewide Assessment
- Review and evaluate state investigative, administrative and both civil and criminal judicial handling of cases of child abuse and neglect.

CJTF

- Provide Policy and Training Recommendations
- Provides system improvement recommendations to the investigation and prosecution of serious child abuse cases, as defined by federal statute.

Focus Areas

- Support Child And Family Advocacy Centers
- Training for Investigators/Prosecutors
- Multidisciplinary Teams (MDTs)
- Information Technology That Improves Case Tracking And Reporting at Advocacy Centers
- Equipment To Conduct Investigations

3-Year Statewide Assessment

- Before receiving funding, adopt recommendations of the CJTF re
 - Investigative, administrative, and judicial handling of cases
 - Cases involving suspected child maltreatment related fatalities
 - Cases involving a potential combination of jurisdictions
- In a manner which
 - Reduces additional trauma to the child and child's family
 - Ensures procedural fairness to the accused

3-Year Statewide Assessment

- Experimental, model, and demonstration programs
 - Innovative approaches to help the prompt and successful resolution of civil and criminal court proceedings or enhance the effectiveness of judicial and administrative action
 - Enhancement of performance of court appointed attorneys and GALs
 - Reform of State laws, regulations, protocols, and procedures to provide comprehensive protection for children

One Example

- Therapy and Rxs are primary treatments for mental health care.
- Shortage in mental health professionals who can prescribe meds is shifting mental healthcare assessment, diagnosis, and treatment to medical professionals.
- There are around 9 child psychiatrists for every 100,000 children in Arizona.
- Some kids are waiting up to 6 months to see a psychiatrist
- Professionals with prescriptive authority is <u>decreasing</u> and the *need* for comprehensive mental healthcare is increasing.

Justice for Victims of Child Sexual Abuse Task Force Recommendations

Orders of Juvenile Court take precedence except

Criminal court order that governs a defendant's ability to contact the victim or family or other minor children if criminal court finds that contact with other minor children would pose risk.

Children placed in out of home care

- ► Those 8 and up must receive age/developmentallyappropriate materials about sexual abuse/trafficking/exploitation.
- Shall include methods for reporting abuse.
- Amendment: Unless doctor/therapist recommends otherwise.

Report number of lawsuits

Clerk shall file report listing lawsuits filed concerning sexual abuse/failure to report.

No Statute of Limitations for Child Sex Trafficking.

Position of Trust Expanded

- Grandparent, aunt, uncle.
- ► Teacher OR ANY SCHOOL EMPLOYEE OR VOLUNTEER AT THE MINOR'S SCHOOL WHO IS 18 OR OLDER.

Position of Trust Expanded

- Coach or instructor, whether the coach or instructor is an employee or volunteer.
- Clergyman or priest OR ANY PERSON WHO IS AT LEAST 18 AND WHO WORKED OR VOLUNTEERED FOR A RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION THAT HOSTED EVENTS OR ACTIVITIES WHERE THE MINOR WAS IN ATTENDANCE.
- Engaged in a sexual or romantic relationship with the minor's parent, adoptive parent, GRANDPARENT, STEPGRANDPARENT, AUNT, UNCLE, legal guardian, foster parent or, stepparent OR SIBLING.

Position of Trust Expanded

- ► RELATED TO THE MINOR BY BLOOD OR MARRIAGE WITHIN THE 3RD DEGREE AND IS AT LEAST 10 YRS OLDER THAN THE MINOR.
- THE MINOR'S EMPLOYER.
- ► AN EMPLOYEE OF A GROUP HOME OR RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FACILITY WHERE THE MINOR RESIDES OR HAS PREVIOUSLY RESIDED. FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, "GROUP HOME" MEANS A CHILD WELFARE AGENCY THAT RECEIVES FOR CARE AND MAINTENANCE A CHILD WHO HAS BEEN ADJUDICATED DEPENDENT.

Limit when pro se defendants question child victims. (ARS 13-4254)

- D charged under Ch 14, 35.1, 13-3206, 13-3212, or 13-3623
- Cannot directly question minor victim
- If court determines that it would prevent victim from being able to reasonably communicate.

Best practices re social media/cell phones

- Bd of Ed shall
 - Establish best practices for social media and cell phone use between students and school personnel.
 - Encourage district/charter school governing boards to implement.
 - Make these available to private schools.

Consistent Mandatory Reporting Law Training

- APAAC shall develop statewide training curriculum for public school personnel.
- Public school shall require personnel to complete.
- DOE shall provide resources for schools/parents/students re Mandatory Reporting to public and private schools.

Recommendations - Civil

- Assist GOYFF in spreading awareness of new law lifting civil S of L
- ► Funding competitive grants for organizations, including FACs to provide services for Vs of sexual abuse, sex trafficking.
- Funding for 24-hour hotline to report abuse
- Work with universities to study extending S of L

Recommendations - Education

- Expand DOE jurisdiction to uncertified educators (currently approx. 6K)
- ► Fund additional DOE investigators to lower caseload from 120-150 to 50.

Recommendations - Education

- ► Require DCS/DOE to come up with program for schools to teach prevention and awareness to teachers and students.
- Spread awareness in schools of 24-hour hotline.

Recommendations

- Special probation terms, including
 - Not enter any school grounds unless registered as a student at that school.
 - Obtain prior written approval of the APD before going within 500 feet of any shelter, safe house, group home or similar facility.
 - Not go to a hotel or motel without the prior written approval of APD.
 - Not loiter in the area of 27th Ave btw Indian School and Northern.

Other Recommendations - Criminal

- Funding mechanism for forensic interviews
- Funding mechanism for cold cases units
- Have DPS study creation of statewide database for LE
